GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

In the event of conflict between the general rules and the special rules governing the various departments, the special rules will take precedence.

The Board reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to, the Fair.

The Board reserves the right to amend or add to these rules, as it, in its judgment, may deem advisable.

ENTRIES

1. An Exhibitor Number has been assigned by the Washington County Treasurer's office to allow better tracking of fair premiums and expedite payment of prize money. If you did not have an entry in the 2007 fair, please contact the Washington County Treasurer's Office for your new number or receive it as you bring your entry to the 2008 fair.
2. The filing of a signed entry form by the exhibitor constitutes a contract between the Washington County Fair and the exhibitor. It indicates the exhibitor's acceptance of Fair department rules and his/her eligibility for premium prize awards as offered by the Washington County Fair.
3. Entry form and charge must be submitted by dates published in this premium catalog.
4. When sufficient entries are received in any department to fill the space available, no further entries will be accepted. To insure entry, it is essential that it be made well in advance of the closing time.

5. A protest against judging, premium book rules, exhibition displays, damage to an exhibit or a disagreement with fair personnel, shall be made in writing to the Fair Chairman stating the exact reason for the complaint. The Fair Chairman and the Fair Board shall consider and act on the complaint.
6. Every exhibit must remain intact until Monday, August 11th, 2008 when they can be picked up between the hours of 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM. All remaining items will be taken to the Washington County Extension Office, 44 North 100 East, in St. George.

LIABILITY OF EXHIBITORS AND PATRONS

In no case shall the Washington County Fair or any of its officers be held responsible for damages in any loss, damage, injury, death or disability by disease or from theft or from any other cause to any such property, or to any person coming upon said Fair area while said persons or property are on said Fair area. The Washington County Fair hereby refuses to assume any responsibility for the safety as bailee or otherwise, or any property brought upon said Fair area, said property being brought upon and kept upon said grounds at owner's risk.

The management reserves the right to exclude from the grounds any person or persons whom they deem undesirable, or expel from the grounds such person or persons who shall violate any of the general or special department rules.

PATRON RULES

1. A patron parking on the Fair parking lot shall pay a parking charge. The charge, which is subject to change, shall be posted at the entrance of the parking area. The management shall not be responsible for damage to vehicles or theft of property from vehicles.
2. The management reserves the right to remove from the Fair area any person who violates the rules of the Fair.
3. The management reserves the right to remove from the Fair area any persons or person distributing advertising material or conducting private business who does not have an authorized Exhibit Space Lease Agreement.
4. A patron involved in any type of accident while in the Fair area shall contact any available Fair Board member and request that a security officer complete an official accident report.
5. No pets, bicycles, motorcycles, roller-blades, roller-skates, skateboards or golf carts shall be allowed in the Fair area without written approval of the Fair Board management. Seeing eye dogs are the only exception.

6. A patron purchasing merchandise or entering into contracts with commercial, educational and non-profit exhibitors is responsible for his transactions. The Fair shall not assume responsibility for faulty merchandise or for agreements entered into by a patron.
7. A patron shall not litter the Fair Park. Trash shall be placed in barrels provided.
8. A patron shall not deface the grounds or buildings, outside or inside. Anyone damaging buildings or grounds shall be required to pay all repair and replacement costs.
9. No fires or flammable materials are allowed in the Fair area without written approval of Fair Board management.
10. Patron shall not remove property from the buildings and grounds.
11. A patron shall adhere to the hours of the Fair which shall be posted in the Fair Book under Schedule of Events.

All who enter items into the Home Arts Division will receive a ticket and become eligible for the prize drawing.

There will be an "early entry incentive" for those who enter on Saturday. They will receive two tickets for prize drawing. All who enter Monday will receive one ticket.

You may enter your Home Arts exhibits either on Saturday, August 2nd from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM or Monday, August 4th from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM.

Canned food can be entered Saturday, Monday, or on Wednesday before 11:00 AM.

ABSOLUTELY no other entries will be accepted after these times.

Baked goods will be entered on Wednesday, August 6th from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM. No entries will be accepted thereafter.

*****General Rules & Guidelines*****

- 1. An exhibitor may enter 2 items in each class.**
The same item duplicated cannot be entered in more than one department!
2. Claim tickets will be given when the items are entered & must be presented to claim premiums and articles.
3. All articles must be completed and clean.
4. All articles must be the work of the exhibitor. Any irregularity in the entry, or fraud by misrepresentation or otherwise detected before or after the awards are made, shall cause the forfeiture of the premiums which will be withheld by the fair board.
5. Articles exhibited at previous county or state fair contests will not be entered for competition. May be on display only.
6. Entries made in this department are limited to legal residents of the county. Articles made by non-county residents will be for display only.
7. The Danish system of judging will be used. The judges will not award premiums unless the articles are deemed worthy of merit. If articles are not worthy of first premium, the judges may award second or third or no premium, according to their judgment.
8. All rules governing entries will be enforced.

9. All premiums must be claimed within 30 days of the county fair dates at the County Treasurers Office, 197 E. Tabernacle Street. Premiums not claimed by this date will be forfeited.
10. All articles must be finished within the past year, August 2007 - August 2008
11. Entries will be judged and categorized by age and skill level.

Absolutely no entry may be reclaimed until Monday Aug. 11th from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair.

Collections, Group, & Individual Displays

You MUST make reservations on ALL collections, group or individual displays by contacting the Home Arts Chairman, Odette Nisson, 673-6748.

Exhibit size is usually approximately 9' x 10' and no higher than 6'. Other size requests may be discussed.

Displays may be set up Saturday, August 2nd from noon to 6:00 PM or on Monday, August 4th from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM.

*****Rules & Guidelines*****

1. The object of interest should be effectively displayed.
2. The 2008 fair theme (It's Showtime!) should be included in your display.
3. The exhibit should attract and hold attention.
4. Titles and captions are simple and to the point but also tell a story.
5. Original ideas are used effectively and show creativeness.
6. The exhibit should be neat and well organized.
7. The exhibit is generally attractive pleasing in overall appearance; balance color schemes are harmonious and appropriate.
8. The exhibit has at least 10 handmade items in it.
9. All rules governing entries in the general Home Arts will also be enforced. Absolutely no entries may be reclaimed before Monday, August 11th from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Items left unclaimed will be taken to the County Extension office for pickup until August 31st, 2008.

2. A completed entry label must accompany each product entered. The required information must include: processing date, method (water bath or pressure canner), time and lbs. of pressure used. (Use canned food entry label on last page of this booklet).
3. All items must be the work of the exhibitor.
4. All preserved food must be displayed in a clear, standard canning jar. Quarts are preferred, but pints are acceptable. All jars should be sealed with NEW standard lids and rings. (NO mayo jars, etc.)
5. All fresh fruits, jams, and jellies must be processed in a boiling water bath and sealed.
6. Products exhibited must have been prepared no earlier than August 2007
7. Mold disqualifies a product.
8. No entries that need to be refrigerated.
9. All rules governing entries in the general Home Arts will also be enforced.
10. All vegetables and meats must be processed in a pressure canner.
11. Exhibits should be canned using USDA, Ball or Kerr guidelines issued 1988 or later.

THE FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL APPLY TO ALL SECTIONS IN THE 4-H DEPARTMENT: QUESTIONS REGARDING ANY OF THESE GUIDELINES, SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO THE COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE.

1. 4-H members must have been in the 3rd through the 12th grade, and not have exceeded their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current exhibit year. All 4-H members must have enrolled with the USU Extension office/Washington County 4-H in each project area they wish to exhibit.

Disabled and special needs adults: These members enrolled in 4-H projects are invited to participate in the county fair and exhibit in the 4-H department. These exhibits may be eligible for the state fair.

2. 4-H members may only enter exhibits in the project(s) and phases(s) in which they are currently enrolled.

3. Members may enter up to 5 items per class and are encouraged to enter as many classes as they wish.

4. All exhibits will be individual and represent the work of the 4-H member. Clubs may also prepare special displays which will be judged as a single exhibit.

5. County exhibits will be judged on quality of work and will be based on the individual merits of the exhibit. Utilizing the Danish judging system, all qualified exhibits entered will be awarded a Blue, Red or White ribbon.

6. The following are additional size requirements for exhibits:

*Any exhibit using posters is limited to one poster, size 22"x28" or smaller.

*Special exhibits or displays showing a collection of hand- made or using the theme "Make A Big Splash" should not exceed a 6x6 free-standing display. Larger exhibits will not be accepted.

*All collection boxes are not to exceed 325 square inches for bottom measurement. The collection must be arranged to allow glass covers to open at the top or side of the box.

*All items entered, which are normally hung on the wall, must provide some means for attachment to the wall (i.e. all paintings, sketches, framed items, woodworking, wall-hangings, articles using artificial or dried flowers are included).

*Be sure exhibits are well made so they are stable enough to be moved.

7. Exhibits must have a completed exhibit card attached securely to it. Exhibits with more than one part must have each part numbered 1 of 3, 2 of 3, 3 of 3, etc. plus the exhibit card number.

8. Food items need to be of a quality to keep without refrigeration for the duration of the fair. A copy of each recipe on a 3"x5" card is requested or list of ingredients.

9. Information forms are required on specific exhibits in home environment, child care and food preservation.

10. Any items to be returned (i.e. hangers, pie pans, cake stands, etc.) should be marked with name and address of the exhibitor. Baked items or garden produce will not be returned without prior special arrangements.

11. The top 25 county exhibits, as selected by the judges, will be sent to the Utah State Fair where they will be judged again. Top entries selected there will receive an Honor rosette and \$5.00 cash award. Each 4-H member with entries in the State Fair will receive one (1) gate admission pass to the Fair.

12. Exhibits will be released Monday, August 11th, 2008 between 9:00 AM and 6:00 PM. **No exhibit may be reclaimed before that time to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair. Articles left at the fair grounds after Monday will be taken to the Extension Office in St. George.**

*****Rules - Guidelines*****

1. Artist must classify himself as Professional, Semi-Pro, or Amateur. Teens 18 and up will be in Amateur class.
2. Entry of Exhibits will be on MONDAY only, August 4th from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM.
3. All paintings must be securely framed with screw eyes and wire for hanging. All entries, therefore, must be completely dry, framed, and hang-able. Entries such as those to be hung with string, tape, and/or glue will NOT be accepted.
4. Work must have been completed within the last 3 years and not previously entered in the Washington County Fair. Entrants must have at least three months residency in the county.
5. Entries must be original work of the artist. Copies and class-taught work can be on display only and given an award, but not a premium. This complies with State requirements. None of the following can be allowed in a family oriented fair: nudity, Satanism, cult, gang related items or killing.
6. Artists may enter two entries in each Medium, (oils, ink, water color, etc.)

7. **Photography Rules!** Due to the increasing popularity of digital photography, we are limiting the size of photo's to no smaller than 8"x10" and no larger than 16" x 20".

- a) All entries must be framed with wire hangers so that they can be hung on pegboard.
- b) NO multiple frames will be accepted.
- c) All photos must be singular, not part of a duo or tryptic, etc.
- d) No duplicate photos of different size or cropping.
- e) Since photos are to be judged on artistic content and quality, please keep frames simple.
- f) Absolutely NO double sided glass frames.
- g) Only two (2) entries per person.

8. Judging will be Tuesday. All entries will be evaluated by qualified judges. Ribbons and premiums will be awarded as per the Danish System. Also, a Sweepstakes award will be selected as first place out of all the Blue Ribbons with Reserve Sweeps indicating 2nd and 3rd, etc. All premium winners are reminded to save their premium receipts for redemption at the Premium Bank..

9. No item may be reclaimed without presentation of the premium stub. **ABSOLUTELY no entry may be reclaimed before Monday, August 11th from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair!** Items left after Monday will be taken to the Washington County Extension Office, 44 N. 100 E. St. George and kept for 30 days.

The Washington County Fair or Fair Board is not responsible for any article remaining after this time.

10. Senior Citizen Division. This division is for county residents 62 or over –particularly for artists just starting out – and classified as Advanced, Amateur, and Beginner. Each participant may place two entries in each medium and be judged, receive awards, and qualify for State.

11. Paintings in Classes 1 and 2 are limited in size to 24x48.

12. Unless otherwise provided, articles can be entered only by the owner or producer, any attempt to perpetrate a fraud by misrepresentation will bar the specimen from competing for any premium. Department supervisors may remove from the grounds, any exhibit that is falsely entered or which may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable and difficult to display.

1. Entries may be made Wednesday, August 6th, between 7:00 am and 11:00 am.
2. All entries of fresh fruit, field crops and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor shall be limited to one entry each variety per person or family.
4. Grapes, prunes, plums, etc. must not be polished. The bloom as it is called, must be left on them.
5. Individual exhibits must have a mark of identification on the bottoms of their exhibits of fruit, field crops, and vegetables. It may be an initial and must be on the bottom of the container in which it is to be exhibited in. Each of the exhibits, regardless of whether it is fruit or vegetable, should have the following qualities:
 - *Trueness to type of the particular variety (only one variety should be used in the same exhibit.)
 - * Good market quality (neither too small or too large)
 - *Uniformity in the size, shape, color, and maturity.
 - *Without insect or disease injury or mechanical injury. They should be clean and ready for judging.

*All exhibits should be labeled correctly according to their variety.

*Extra large produce will be given special consideration.

Any questions on how to display will be answered by the personnel in the display area when the produce is brought in.

All produce must be picked up no earlier than Monday, August 11th between 9:00 AM and Noon to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair.
