Rules - Guidelines

1. Fresh flower exhibits will be entered on Wednesday, August 11th from 7:00 AM to 11:00 AM ONLY. No entries will be taken after this time as judging will begin.
2. Judging will be Wednesday and their decision will be final. Each entry will be marked with an entry tag for identification purposes. ALL ENTRIES must remain anonymous until judging is COMPLETE. No one is allowed in during the judging.
3. A person may enter one exhibit in each class number whether it be individual or a grouping of plants. If there isn't a classification the display can be entered in the "Other" category.
4. Separate Awards shall be given in all classes and for displays on an individual basis. PROFESSIONALS AND AMATEURS WILL NOT BE JUDGED TOGETHER. Amateurs will be on one side of the Horticulture display and the professionals on the other side.

Department 9 Field & Crop Division

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*****Rules - Guidelines*****

1. Entries may be made Wednesday, August 11th, between 7:00 am and 11:00 am.
2. All entries of fresh fruit, field crops and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor shall be limited to one entry each variety per person or family.
4. Grapes, prunes, plums, etc. must not be polished. The bloom as it is called, must be left on them.
5. Individual exhibits must have a mark of identification on the bottoms of their exhibits of fruit, field crops, and vegetables. It may be an initial and must be on the bottom of the container in which it is to be exhibited in. Each of the exhibits, regardless of whether it is fruit or vegetable, should have the following qualities:

*Trueness to type of the particular variety (only one variety should be used in the same exhibit.)

* Good market quality (neither too small or too large)

*Uniformity in the size, shape, color, and maturity.

*Without insect or disease injury or mechanical injury. They should be clean and ready for judging.

*All exhibits should be labeled correctly according to their variety.

*Extra large produce will be given special consideration.

Any questions on how to display will be answered by the personnel in the display area when the produce is brought in.

All produce must be picked up no earlier than Monday, August 16th between 9:00 AM and Noon to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair.

Please indicate on ticket if you want your fruits & vegetables to go to Care & Share.

Quantity and quality of products used	30 pts.
Theme of display	10 pts.
